USD 307 BOARD OF EDUCATION POSITION 1 VACANCY

USD 307 Board of Education Position 1 is currently open. The intent of the board is to appoint someone at the February 8 meeting to fill the position. The board will interview applicants at that meeting and the selected individual will take office that same evening. The appointment will be effective only until June 30, 2011, and the position will be up for election on the April 2011 ballot.

To be eligible to be appointed to this position, you must live in the area of Position 1: the entire area of the district west of Powers Rd. from the northern to the southern edges of the district plus the area between Railroad Ave. and Stimmel Rd. east from Powers Rd. to Hedville Rd.

BOARD MEETING REPORT

January 11 Board Meeting Report

All board members were present. Action taken was on a 6-0 vote unless noted otherwise.

7:00 P.M. REGULAR MEETING

AUDIENCE WITH THE BOARD

Bob Holgerson addressed the board with suggested changes on the facilities project.

REPORTS

Audit – Jay Langley of Clubine & Rettele presented the audit findings on last year's financial records. There were no significant deficiencies, cash basis or budget violations. He also complimented both Ann and Susan on the work they do and the professional way they work with the auditors.

BOE – Jamie Bradley gave a brief review of the KASB Convention that he and Delbert attended in December.

Mr. McDaniel – His report included: dual credit courses are starting this semester; the end of the semester went well with very few PowerSchool problems and the students appreciated the last day activities; work is progressing on the NCA Integrated Improvement Plan; and reviewed upcoming parent informational meetings and ballgames

Mrs. Sprinkle – Her report included: January 18 In-Service Day activities; state assessment staff training is scheduled; the 6th grade students will be taking the Kansas Communities That Care survey; and student activities.

Mr. Minneman – His report included: update on facilities; state budget; KASB seminars; and shared a list of dates that he will be attending meetings out of the district before the next meeting.

BUSINESS

MS Activity Bus—It was the consensus of the board that all parents of MS students that paid for that service this year will be admitted free to one basketball game this year. For future years the number of tutoring students that also rode

the MS activity bus the previous year will be provided to the MS parents to be added into the total number of families participating. This will reduce each families' share of the MS activity bus expense.

A1. Accept Resignation—This item was added during the APPROVAL/MODIFICATION OF THE AGENDA section. Laurie Came's resignation as the Head HS Volleyball Coach was accepted.

Fall Sport Supplemental Positions—The list of recommendations for fall sport supplemental positions was approved as presented. The list included all current coaches less Laurie Came whose resignation was accepted in A1 above.

Board Vacancy—The vacancy in Board Position 1 is to be filled at the February 8 board meeting.

Superintendent's Contract—The Superintendent's contract was extended for another year which takes me through the 2011-2012 school year. The salary is set following teacher negotiations.

Student Participation Guidelines—This was a discussion only item. At a future board meeting, the administrators will include in their report the guidelines that are followed with students that request to attend school functions when they are not taking classes on our campus.

There were two Executive Sessions (Personnel and Negotiations) with one being before the BUSINESS section of the meeting and one following it. No action was taken following either of them.

The meeting adjourned at 10:00 p.m.

FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S DESK

Welcome to 2010! I hope that over the holidays you had time to enjoy family and friends. The bitterly cold temperatures and blowing snow made it difficult for some people to get to their family gatherings so some plans had to be changed. It hasn't been so much cold and snow this last week causing travel problems but the fog has definitely been a challenge. In just a few weeks it will be spring and I'm looking forward to warmer, clearer weather conditions that usually come with it.

Along with the certainty of winter weather this time of year is the annual reconvening of the state legislature. Again this year they have a monumental task facing them. That task lies in how to address the state's budget deficit. As I reported last month all school districts have already had their budgets cut once this year from the time the budgets were adopted in August. Without some type of revenue enhancement at the state level to reduce the state deficit, we will have another cut before the end of the year. I have met with the staff in each building and the elementary site-council to share the severity of the cuts that we have had the last few years and anticipate in years to come. I will meet with the MS/HS site-council when they meet in February. If you have any ideas or suggestions on how we can absorb the cuts, please pass them along to me using any of the following methods (jminneman@ellsaline.org, 225-6813, Box 157, Brookville 67425, or see me in person). All suggestions are welcome. If you are concerned about the future of our schools, public education in general, or any of the other quality of life programs that are funded by the State of Kansas, I encourage you to contact your legislators and express your concern to them. We, as school administrators and board members have been doing so for several years and they're now telling us that they need to hear from you the parents, patrons, constituents, voters before the message will have much impact. The contact information for our area legislators is listed at the end of this article. Again, I encourage you to contact them! For the future of our state, it is important.

Fortunately for our district and community our school board and administration have exercised fiscal responsibility in past years that has cushioned us for times such as these. However, it was impossible to be completely prepared for the times we are in. As our resources get ever tighter locally we will have to make some difficult decisions. Our school board and administrators feel strongly that education comes first. Any resource reallocation that occurs will have that in mind. However, regardless of what changes we have to make, they will have a negative impact on our students' education. The responsibility of educating the youth of our community is something that your school board, administration and faculty take seriously. As we work through these difficult economic times we will strive to continue providing the outstanding education you have come to expect from USD 307. We will continue to make financial decisions that balance fiscal responsibility and the highest quality of education.

If you have been past either of our school buildings you have probably seen that the construction company has been here and begun their preliminary work. At the MS/HS there are many flags in the ground and paint markings on the concrete indicating where the utilities lie underground. At the elementary school the tree to the south of the building has been cut down and the fence along the west side of the property has been removed to provide for an access drive. As the weather improves the work will begin in earnest. One of the first major changes you will see at the MS/HS is that of a traffic pattern change in front of the building. The driveway from the east end of the Bernie White Gymnasium to just west of the football concession stand area will be fenced off as a construction area. Traffic will not be allowed to travel through that area which will create congestion in both the east and the west parking lots as well as creating challenges on entering both the gymnasium area and the main classroom area. More information will be coming on what the best way to enter the facility will be.

Thank you for your continued trust and confidence in the Ell-Saline USD 307 school district. You can be assured that your children continue to receive a quality education.
