

## FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S DESK

Welcome to autumn from Ell-Saline USD 307. The rains of the last week have been timely for some of the fall crops as they were looking quite stressed. We are at the point now where we need some warmer, drier days so that the ground can be worked for planting wheat and for the soybeans and milo to mature before the first frost hits. With the daylight hours becoming fewer, there is a definite coolness in the air as evening approaches and we see the beginning stages of color changes in the tree leaves and in some of the crops. Ah, autumn is such a beautiful, picturesque time of year!

It is hard to imagine that by the time this reaches you September will be almost behind us and that we will have been in school for more than a month. Where has the time gone and what has been accomplished? Normally when time goes so quickly it is because of being busy and of things going smoothly and this has been the case this year. Overall it has been one of the most positive beginnings to a year that I have been a part of for a while. The atmosphere in the buildings is one of calm and order, even with the construction taking place, and the staff and students are working hard. Our students have taken the MAP assessment, DRA assessment, attended STARBASE, had a Book Fair, attended the state fair, played volleyball and football games, been on FFA, yearbook and other class field trips, and ordered sophomore class rings and senior graduation announcements just to mention some of what has been taking place. Our staff has attended out-of-district workshops, as well as several meetings within their buildings or the district, to gain information on teaching strategies and assessments. It is a busy, productive start to the school year.

As a district we are only as strong as all parts working together are. Last week there was another great opportunity for this to happen. That opportunity was in taking part in Parent-Teacher Conferences. It was again refreshing to see the large turnout and the serious approach that our parents/guardians take in the education of their children. Please don't hesitate to visit your child's teacher at any time during the year that you have questions or concerns. You can also check on your child's progress at any time by going to the PowerSchool link on our district website. Contact the building principal if you need help with your username or password.

Again last year the joint effort among the staff, students and parents points out the strength of our academic programs as both our elementary school and middle/high school continued to do very well as we strive to meet the Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) goal of 100% of our students scoring at Meets Standards or above in 2014. Both of our buildings did MEET THE STANDARD on the state reading and math assessments last year. In addition to the accomplishments on the state assessments, our high school students that took the ACT exam had a Composite Score close to the state average. All of this helps illustrate not only the strength of our faculty and curriculum in grades K-12 but also the importance that you as parents place on the education of your children by encouraging and helping them with their studies. We appreciate all that you do to help make our jobs more rewarding.

Although the threat of an H1N1 virus outbreak this year is not as great as it was last year it is still important to take precautions and practice good hygiene measures. Reducing the potential spread of the H1N1 virus provides another opportunity for us all to work together. Three ways for families, students and school staff to reduce the risk of getting sick from the flu are: (1) Practice good hand hygiene by washing your hands often with soap and water, especially after sneezing or coughing. (2) Practice respiratory etiquette by covering your mouth and nose with a tissue when sneezing or coughing. If a tissue is not available then you should sneeze or cough into your elbow or shoulder rather than into your hands. (3) Staying home when you are sick. Staying at home means that you keep the virus to yourself rather than sharing it with others. It is recommended that individuals with flu-like illnesses stay at home until at least 24 hours after they no longer have a fever or signs of a fever without the use of fever reducing medications.

Yet another example of everyone working together is in adjusting to the inconveniences associated with our construction project. For those of you that have been on either of our campuses, or have students in either building, you have undoubtedly noticed or heard of some of these. Probably the biggest inconvenience is at the MS/HS where there is not an indoor pathway between the classroom area and the gymnasium area or easy access from the west parking lot to the gymnasiums. To help get from the classroom area to the gymnasium area a sidewalk was poured along the north side of the building which will have a canopy placed over it this winter. To get from the west parking lot to the gymnasiums the two ways are either to go around the north side of the school or walk in front of the football bleachers. Neither of these is very convenient but at least for now they are the only way to get between those two locations. As you have seen at the volleyball and football games we have had to relocate our concession stand. We are still looking at where this will be located during the basketball season. The important thing to remember is that these inconveniences are short term and will last only for this year since construction is anticipated to be completed by the time school starts next fall.

Thank you for your continued trust and confidence in the Ell-Saline USD 307 school district. You can be assured that your children are receiving a quality education. Please call or stop in so we can visit about the good things going on in the district and we can get to know each other.

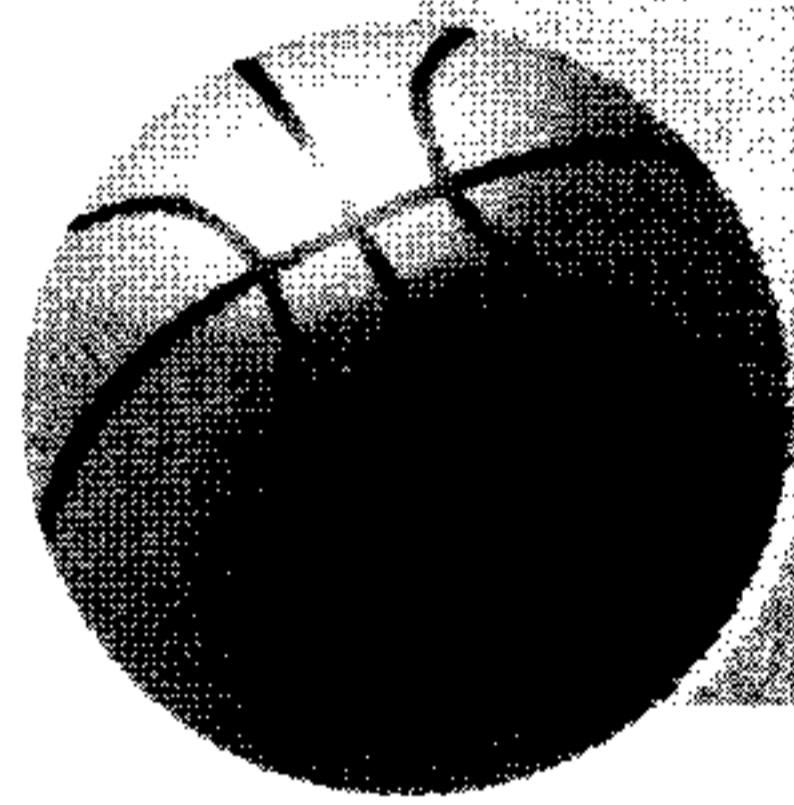
## Jordan Pieschl

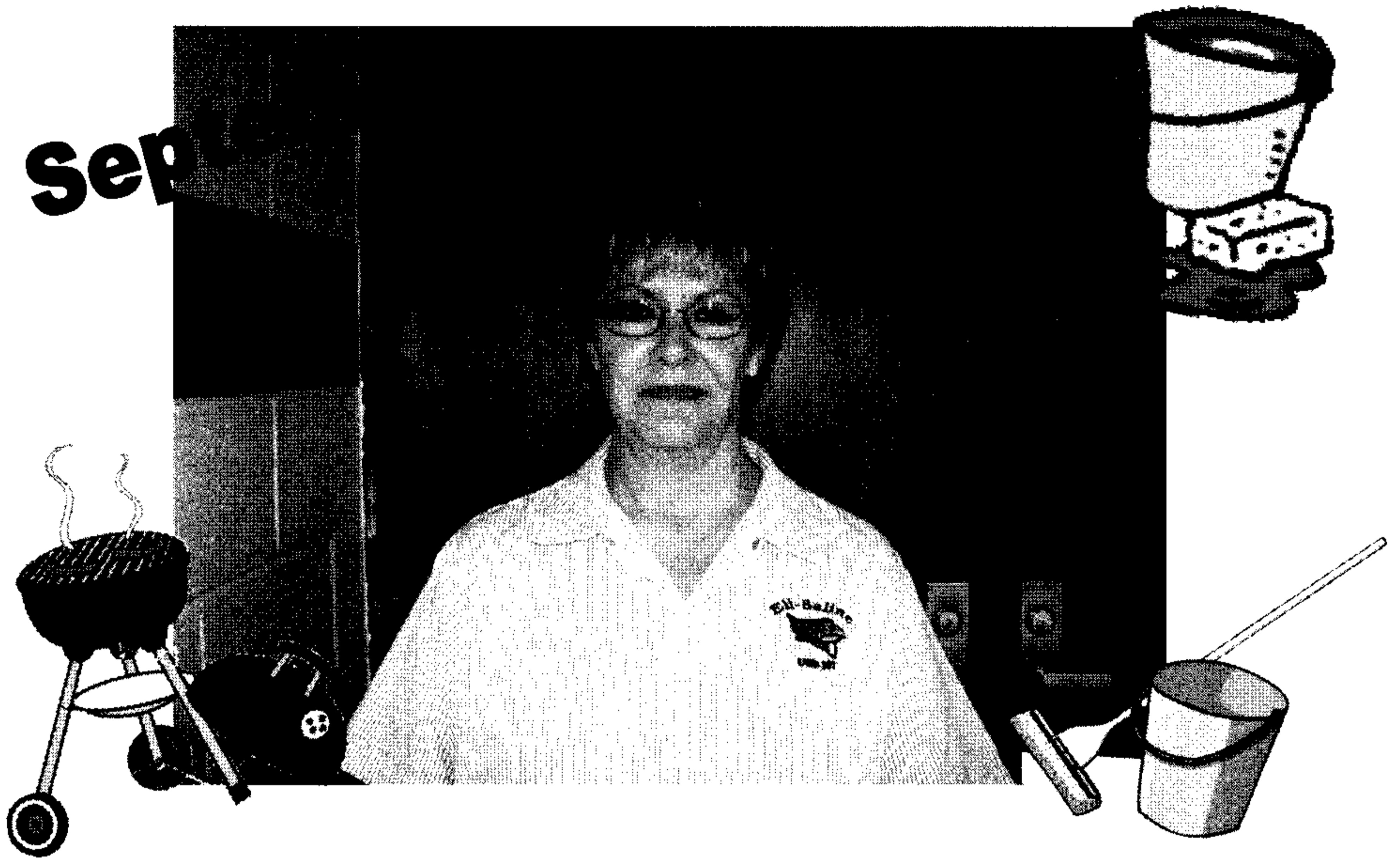
