



Education Funding in Kansas has been a constant topic as state revenue has decreased. Many reports in the media from legislators have focused on the percentage of funding dollars that go directly to classrooms and instruction. Those reports have stated less than 65% of funding dollars go towards instruction. The categories considered a part of instruction have been based on a narrow definition. The graphic below shares a more accurate and inclusive definition of the areas that impact student instruction. The inclusion of ALL the areas that impact instruction shows a state average just over 85%. That's a big difference. It's important to stay informed and to check out what you hear.



# When to Keep Your Child Home From School



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- If they have had a fever in the past 24 hours after you have stopped giving Tylenol or Ibuprofen.
- If they have been nauseated, had diarrhea or vomited in the past 24 hours.
- If they have muscle aches combined with fatigue.
- If they have nasal drainage or a productive cough that is green in color or worsening.

During cold and flu season, keeping your sick child home will help to decrease the number of school children affected.

CHALLENGE INCENTIVE

Goal & 1/2 Award—Each student can earn a prize for achieving individual point goals plus additional Appropriate points equaling half their point goal. Students will select their own prize from the Goal & 1/2 Store. ★

Comprehension levels have increased for the Goal and 1/2 award. Students in Grades 1-2 will need to maintain 87% comprehension to qualify for the reward. Students in Grades 3-6 will need to maintain 90% comprehension to qualify for the reward.

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
