SCHOOLMESSENGER TEXT OPTION

The text feature of our SchoolMessenger calling program was initiated earlier this year. Since the information on how to subscribe may not have reached everyone, we are providing the information once again. A letter containing this information will also be going home with the elementary school December newsletter.

SMS text messaging is not intended to replace our other means of communication—rather it enhances them. The district will only use the service to provide information that is timely and relevant. In order to participate in the SMS text messaging service you must indicate your willingness to receive text messages to your phone. The process is simple and only takes a few seconds to complete.

Simply text any one of the following words to the number **68453**: subscribe, optin, yes

You'll know you were successful if you receive the following reply message:

You are registered to receive approx 3 msgs/mo. Text STOP to quit, HELP for help.

You'll need to repeat the opt-in process for any wireless numbers that you wish to include. In addition to performing the opt-in process above you'll want to insure that the district has your wireless number (s) in our student information database. If you haven't already provided that information to us please contact either building and provide us with that information.

FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S DESK

By the time you are reading this we will be knocking on the door to enter December. Normally that means that winter is quickly approaching and with that comes the possibility of snow, ice, and general dangerous weather conditions. If we were in northwest Kansas we would have already experienced it!

When dangerous weather conditions happen on a scheduled school day then a decision needs to be made regarding whether or not to have school. Ideally the decision can be made the night before so that parents have more time to make arrangements for their child for the day. However, the weather does not always give us that much advance warning and a decision isn't made until early in the morning. An attempt will always be made to make a decision by 6:00 a.m. but conditions can worsen at any time. To help in making what appears to be the best decision we check the radar, weather predictions, current road conditions and what other neighboring school districts are planning. Safety of students, staff and parents is the primary consideration in making a decision. If travel conditions are not good at the time of our normal school beginning or if there is a strong likelihood that the weather will deteriorate during the day so that it will not be safe to get everybody home, then school will likely be called off for the day. It is much more difficult for parents to have a late start to the school day or dismiss school earlier than normal than it is to call off for the entire day. If the weather prediction is for dangerous weather or if it is "not looking good out there" a SchoolMessenger call and/or text will be made so that word gets out to everyone very quickly. Also, tune local radio and TV stations. Each of those stations will be contacted as soon as any decision is made to modify the normal school day because of weather conditions. If the decision is made for an early dismissal after school has already started for the day, we will also have the notice on our district web site (www.ellsaline.org). Good communication at those times is critical.

A second piece of communication that will be important for each of us to stay current on throughout the winter and spring are the decisions taking place in Topeka. We are all aware that the state's revenue has consistently been several million dollars below the projections to the point that now the projections have been lowered by several million dollars. What we haven't heard is how that will impact not only school district budgets but also all other programs and services provided by state funding. It will be interesting to see how the Governor and legislature plan to work through this without making severe cuts to services for several years to come.

The state budget is not the only topic in Topeka to keep an eye on. It will also be important to carefully monitor what legislation is being proposed. There is a strong likelihood that again this year several proposals that are detrimental to public K-12 education will be introduced. A sampling of issues impacting either citizens in general or school districts in particular that are likely to be addressed this legislative session include: changes in the manner of which judges are selected; a funding formula for K-12 education; more interest in voucher, charter schools, social promotion; likely continued support for the Governor's tax policy; and even more demand for "school efficiency" audits and practices with possibly more state control of budgets and budgeting. For Kansas to remain the great place it is to live and raise a family and for Kansas to maintain the high quality of education that our students deserve, it will be extremely important that we all stay up-to-date on what is being proposed in Topeka and communicate our concerns to our area legislators.
