FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S DESK

Welcome to 2018! I hope that over the holidays you had time to enjoy family and friends and were safe in all of your travels. At least for the most part this year the roads were in good shape over the holidays although it was bitterly cold. The students' wishes for Snow Days have been answered since we've returned from the Christmas Vacation as we have missed some days and had a late start because of the weather.

For each of the last several years as the legislature reconvened and the Governor laid out his annual plans in the State of the State address and in his proposed budget, my January articles have been primarily of concern for the negative impact they would have on K-12 public education. Although I do have concerns again this year, I do also have a feeling of hope that this year will continue on a more positive track like last year. That feeling of hope comes from knowing that last year a group of Republican and Democrat legislators worked together in passing legislation that begins to turn around the State's financial crisis. During the last two months I've been able to visit with our area legislators, as well as those from a wider area, to hear their thoughts on what to expect this session. From their perspective, again this year we will see legislators from both parties working together for the common good of the State. They have the unenviable task of making some very difficult decisions but they do appear to be open to looking at all options and working together to find the best solution for the State as a whole.

At the state level most of my concerns continue to be with the condition of the State's finances although the monthly revenue has exceeded the estimates. How will the legislature address the Supreme Court ruling that schools continue to be underfunded, and to what degree will soon-to-be Governor Colyer be involved in solving any of the challenges that the State faces?

In Governor Brownback's State of the State Address and proposed budget, he took a 180 degree turn from the previous seven years on his view of funding K-12 public education. His budget calls for an additional \$600 million spread over 5 years. However, he didn't provide a plan for how the State would provide those additional funds. Some of the specific items he proposed funding for include:

- increase the number of school counselors and psychologists by 150 each year for the next 5 years;
- increase the average teacher pay by 2023 to the point that Kansas is the highest of any of our neighboring states which would require an average increase of roughly \$4,000;
- move more schools toward the Kansans Can redesign model;
- *i* allow every high school student to take up to 15 hours of dual credit courses at no cost to the student;
- cover the cost of every student wanting to take the ACT or Work Keys assessment one time;
- fully cover the cost for high school students working toward certain career or technical education certificates or degrees;
 and
- raise the BSAPP from the current \$4,006 to \$4,761 by 2023.

His proposal was praised by some legislators and denounced by others. Whichever side of that they landed on the commonality was in wondering how the Governor expected it to be paid for. Now that he has been approved as the Ambassador-at-Large for International Religious Freedom, he won't be here to help find the solutions.

The atmosphere in Topeka again this year does give me continued reason for hope about the future of the State and the future of K-12 public education in rural areas. With that being said, though, it will take considerable work and some sacrifice on everybody's part for the State to get back to being on solid financial ground. If you are concerned about the future of our schools, public education in general, or any of the other quality of life programs that are funded by the State of Kansas, I encourage you to contact your legislators and express your concern to them. We, as school administrators and board members have been doing so for many years and our comments often fell on deaf ears although last year they were much better received. The biggest impact, however, will continue to be when they hear from you the parents, patrons, constituents, and voters. Again, I encourage you to contact them! For the future of our State, it is important. Contact information for our area legislators is provided below.

Thank you for your continued trust and confidence in the Ell-Saline USD 307 school district. You can be assured that your children continue to receive a quality education.
