V. REPORTS

BOE – Jamie Bradley reported that the invitations for the Cardinal Foundation Fundraiser to be held on September 16 at C & W Ranch have been mailed.

Mrs. Sprinkle – Her report included: projected enrollment; this year's ESE theme of "Cardinal Culture"; a list of new staff members; CPTA activities; Preschool Day Camp currently has 13 children planning to attend; special education services; and staff professional development activities.

Mr. Wilson – His report included: teacher in-service activities; enrollment day went smoothly; projected enrollment; fall sports practices starting; complimented the custodial staff on their work in preparing the building and grounds for the start of school; and thanked the board for their efforts in providing our students with an environment in which they are able to learn.

FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S DESK

Greetings and Welcome to the 2017-2018 school year at Ell-Saline USD 307. The last door of summer has closed and the first door of a new school year has opened. The cooler than normal weather this past week has really been a help. The year has started very smoothly in each building.

Each of the last few years, the district has had a motto to help keep everyone focused and moving in the same direction. This year's district motto was selected because it is at the very root for helping every student to be as successful as possible. Relationships – we all do have and have had relationships. Some of them have been better than others. We've had relationships with family members, spouses, neighbors, co-workers, our teachers and coaches when we were in school and many other types of settings. My guess is that through all of those relationships you felt closer to, more willing to work for, or lend a helping hand to those with whom you had positive relationships. That is exactly the same way it is with students today. When they have a positive relationship with their teachers, they feel more comfortable and safe in the classroom. In turn, they are more likely to engage actively in class which leads to greater social and academic growth. However, the positive relationships we work toward aren't just those between teachers and students. They are also between all (cooks, secretaries, bus drivers, paras, custodians, superintendent) staff members and students, amongst staff members, staff members and parents, everyone that plays any part in the students' education. Only through all of us making the effort to work on positive relationships will we be able to be the kind of team necessary for each student to reach his or her potential. All of this led to selecting this year's Ell-Saline USD 307 district motto "Ell-Saline—Where Positive Relationships Make The Difference!"

Every year brings new beginnings with the accompanying excitement and apprehension. The excitement stems from: having several new staff members sharing either their prior experiences or fresh out of college ideas; knowing that the staff has attended workshops and classes over the summer to improve instruction; having students and staff around again; the buses being all shined up after a year of road grime; and new students and families to our district joining us. The apprehension stems from: having all of the materials/supplies that were ordered come in; is all of the technology working as it is supposed to be; do we have enough desks for everyone; do we have everyone on a bus route that is supposed to be; is the air conditioning working; with all of the increased traffic on the roads is everyone being extra careful; how are our new staff and students adapting and are we helping them to feel welcome. Sadly, as the year goes by we normally are caught up in the daily routines and we tend to lose the "excitement" that comes with the beginning of the year. On the other hand, we normally discover that our apprehensions were all taken care of and that it has been another good beginning of a new school year. This year again has been no different. We appear to be off to a GREAT start!

This year's enrollment is down by 12 students from last year that is at the lowest level it has been after several years of enrollment increases. The main reason for the decrease is last year we graduated a large senior class and are bringing in a smaller kindergarten class. We currently have 442 students enrolled. As has been the case for the last few years, one of the pieces of information that I think tells a great deal about the education our students receive, and the reputation that Ell-Saline USD 307 has, is in the large number of out-of-district students that apply to attend with us. At the August board meeting, 21 new out-of-district students were approved and many more potential students were not even brought to the board for approval because our class sizes are already at capacity or after doing the background checks it was determined that we would not be a good fit for them. Again this year between 40 and 45% of our students are from out-of-district. When that many students are attending here by family choice rather than simply by living here, it is apparent that word continues to get out about the many great things we do here for students.

As is the case every year, we have a few new staff members that will help us to serve our students even better. District wide we have six teachers and classified staff members that either are new to the district or are in a new role this year. New at the elementary school are: Erin Hecker, library para who has been a substitute teacher for us the last few years; Leslie Hecker, Title I Reading; Danielle Lee, 4th Grade; Stephanie Lindsay, 6th Grade, who has substituted for us in the past; and Rachel Thaemert, 6th Grade. New at the MS/HS is Stacey Scritchfield, special education teacher as well the Head HS Volleyball Coach. We also have two student teachers at the elementary school as Emily Girard from Kansas Wesleyan is working with Amber Fouard in 1st Grade and Sabrina Patrick from Bethany is with Robyn Parker in 3rd Grade. We welcome each of these individuals and look forward to many good years of working together and the fresh ideas that they bring to us.

A challenge every year is in building a budget that provides us with the resources necessary to continue to provide the opportunities that help our students be successful. We also balance that with being mindful of not placing too much additional tax burden on our patrons. This year, again, I feel that we have been able to meet both of those criteria while still looking to the future. Funding this year is based on a formula that is very similar to the old formula that was in place before the Block Grant system. One of the differences from the old formula is that even though it is based on enrollment, it is not the current year enrollment but rather the previous year enrollment. Therefore, the number of students we have this year isn't as critical for this year but it will have an impact on next year. Another difference is that kindergarten students that attend for the full day are counted as 1.0 for headcount instead of 0.5 as they were previously. A positive for us again this year is that our Assessed Valuation continues to grow and is up by roughly \$1,160,000.00. Unfortunately, we were not able to maintain the same mill levy or decrease it this year as it increased by 0.817 mills to 54.303 mills. The reason behind the increase is that we have a loss of approximately \$50,000.00 in state aid for our LOB. Under the new formula, state aid on the LOB will be exactly what it was the year before. To lower the LOB mill levy and thus provide tax relief in the future to our patrons, we raised the LOB mill levy to the maximum in order to receive more state aid next year. To ease the additional LOB tax burden on our patrons this year, we eliminated the 4.000 Capital Outlay mill levy. In order to maintain its solid balance, we will make a transfer from the General Fund to Capital Outlay. We are appreciative of the support our patrons continue to give us as we strive to be good stewards of your tax dollars.

Thank you for your continued trust and confidence in the Ell-Saline USD 307 school district. You can be assured that your children are receiving a quality education. Please call or stop in so we can visit about the good things going on in your district.
