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FROM THE DESK OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

It's official! The 2019-2020 School Year is underway! The start of the school year is always filled with excitement. Our custodians have worked hard to get the facilities in top shape. Teachers have planned for engaging our students. Students are ready to see their classmates again and get active the many organizations and activities offered. From the distant eye, the 2019-2020 school year may appear to be just another school year. To the close observer, the 2019-2020 school year is going to be one to remember.

You might remember that last year our Staff and School Board voted to join the Apollo group in the Redesign Process. The Redesign Process is basically the Kansas initiative for school improvement. Four years ago, the Kansas Commissioner of Education traveled the state asking parents, business owners and community members how to improve education and what our students needed to succeed. Based on the results of this tour, the Kansas State Department of Education (KSDE) developed a new vision, "Kansas leads the world in the success of each student." It was decided that they would measure progress toward this vision with five outcomes: 1. Social-emotional growth; 2. Kindergarten readiness; 3. Individual Plan of Study based on career interest; 4. High School Graduation; and 5. Postsecondary Success. The state defines a successful Kansas high school graduate as having the academic preparation, cognitive preparation, technical skills, employability skills and civic engagement to be successful in postsecondary education, in the attainment of an industry recognized certification or in the workforce, without the need for remediation. These are lofty goals and challenging outcomes set by the KSDE. The Redesign Process was developed to help schools reach this goal and outcomes. Four principles were identified for the Redesign Process:

- 1. Student Success Skills: Development of Soft Skills and Social Emotional Development
- 2. Community Partnerships: Mutually beneficial relationships
- 3. Personalized Learning: Students have choice over their time, place, pace and path in regards to learning.
- 4. Real-World Applications: Project-based learning, internships and civic engagement to make learning relevant. (https://www.ksde.org/Portals/0/Communications/KC_School_Redesign/RedesignTalkingPoints.pdf?ver=2019-02-12-131901-543)

You might be asking why does our school need to improve. Most of our kids graduate. Many go to college and several graduate college. You would be correct in making these statements. The state research indicates that in 2020, 71% of all jobs are going to require some kind of certification or post-secondary degree. Statewide, only 87% of students graduate high school and 69% enroll in college but only 31% will graduate from college or get a post-secondary certification. As you can see, there seems to be a discrepancy between what students are going to need to get a job and what students are doing to prepare for getting a job. Entry level jobs are harder to find. Just look at the kiosks at Mcdonalds, Taco Bell, and Walmart. Self-driving trucks, cabs, ubers and even school buses are being experimented with. We can no longer prepare kids for our past. We must prepare them to be successful in their futures.

With this knowledge in hand, our staff will spend this year discussing what this looks like for Ell-Saline School District. During this process, we will be asking parents and community members for input. Our goal is to work with our community to give our students the necessary knowledge, skills and experiences to help make them successful when they graduate.
