

USD 307 Reopening Plan Outline

It should be understood that we cannot eliminate the possibility of students contracting COVID-19. It is our goal to lower the risk for our students and staff as much as possible. There is a risk of contracting COVID-19 at school and school related activities.

SANITATION PROCEDURES

Screening Questions and Temperatures will be taken of all staff and students before entering the building.

All students and staff must wear masks while in the building. “Mask Breaks” will be taken as needed.

Students and staff must use hand sanitizer upon entering the building. Students and staff must wash their hands or use hand sanitizer every hour during the school day.

Students will clean their desk/table area at the end of each class period.

Students will be spaced out as much as possible during classes.

Common areas and “high touch” areas in the building will be cleaned regularly during the day.

TRANSPORTATION

Students will have their temperatures taken before boarding the bus. Parents must be prepared for their student not to be allowed on the bus if they have a temperature of 100 degrees or higher.

Siblings will sit together on the bus.

Students will have assigned seats on the bus.

All students must wear a mask while on the bus. Students not following mask wearing expectations will lose transportation privileges.

TEACHING PLATFORMS: On-Site Learning, Hybrid Learning, Remote Learning

On-Site Learning:

We plan to start with On-Site Learning with all students and teachers. It is our goal to have On-Site Learning as much as possible.

Factors that will determine On-Site Learning:

- Local, County and State Pandemic Trends
- KDHE, Saline County Health Department, and KSDE Guidance
- Available Staffing at USD 307

Hybrid Learning:

Students have been divided into two groups: Red and White

The Red Group will attend On-Site on Monday and Tuesday and Remote Learn on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

The White Group will Remote Learn on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and attend On-Site Thursday and Friday.

All students will Remote Learn on Wednesday unless needing to take part in extended Learning Groups. These groups will be determined as needed and will vary from week-to-week.

Factors that will determine Hybrid Learning:

- Local, County and State Pandemic Trends
- KDHE, Saline County Health Department, and KSDE Guidance
- Available Staffing at USD 307
- Busing and Social Distancing requirements

Remote Learning:

Students Remote Learning will be required to attend their classes virtually through Zoom just as if they were attending On-Site.

Students Remote Learning will be required to keep a log of their school work minutes with the total minutes equaling the same minutes as if attending On-Site. Parents and the student must sign the log and turn it in weekly to the school.

Students Remote Learning must be available to meet via telephone or live video each day.

Students choosing to Remote Learn instead of learning On-Site must have internet access.

If USD 307 must move to the Hybrid Learning or Remote Learning due to safety or other issues, students without Internet Access will be accommodated.

- KDHE, Saline County Health Department, and KSDE Guidance
- Available Staffing at USD 307
- Busing and Social Distancing requirements

FOOD SERVICE

Students will have assigned seats for breakfast and lunch.

Students will be spaced out as much as possible.

Breakfast and Lunches will be packaged in individual “to go” containers.

Additional Lunch periods will be added to enable social distancing during lunch.

Student Remote Learning may be able to purchase and pick up meals at the assigned school (Pending USDA approval) for consumption at home.
