STUDENT DEPENDENCY STATUS QUESTIONS

The following questions will determine if parental data is needed on the student's FAFSA

If you answer "no" to every question, you are considered a dependent student and <u>must</u> provide parental information on the FAFSA.

If you answer "yes" to any question, you are considered an independent student and <u>should not</u> include parental information on the FAFSA.
